May Message From Pastor Tim

Embrace the Change, Continue the Journey

Today is the day after the record setting April snow storm. The ground and trees still remain covered in a blanket of white, the pale gray clouds hover overhead offering a glimpse of light and hope for warmer and sunnier days.

None of us needed to be surprised by the storm that released this last gasp of winter. The weather prognosticators all predicted snow would blanket the region. Yet nearly everyone I talked to seemed very unhappy about the latest storm. Despite knowing about the impending storm, we still find it disheartening and discouraging.

The scriptures proclaim many warnings. The Israelites were warned by Moses, Joshua, and the prophets not to worship false idols. God gave the Israelites the Commandments. In exodus 20:4-6, God writes, "You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments." (NIV). God warns the people not turn away, or there will be consequences.

The Old Testament people knew the consequences and still managed to fall away from God's love, but not His covenant. For this reason, God sent Jesus, His only Son, to pay the price God knew we could never pay. But this did not remove the obligation to remain faithful to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Book of Revelation shares with us the consequences of failing to remain loyal to the Trinity, and to follow the will of God. "Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death. Anyone who's name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire." (Rev 20:14-15 NIV)

I write this not to frighten anyone, but to share in the warning. God provided the way to eternal life and for our names to be written in the Lambs Book of life. We must believe in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. We must not run scared when life gets tough, but put our whole trust in God. And finally we must never shy away from proclaiming the name of Jesus. Over the next several weeks each of us will experience change, and we may be tempted to run away from the change. But we must embrace it. We know change is coming, we understand the process of

Itinerant pastors, and we must embrace what comes next in order to grow in our faith and journey with God. May brings with it plenty of changes, flowers bloom, trees begin to leaf, and we prepare our gardens in hope of a bountiful crop in the late summer and fall.

Just like May, we must prepare our hearts and souls for changes that we know are coming. Embrace the change, and continue the journey of faith that leads to sanctification in Jesus Christ.

Lee Appointed to St. Marys UMC Announced: 04-17-2022

About Sang Hak Lee

Sang Hak Lee was born and raised in Seoul, South Korea in a devoted Christian household. He learned how to serve God and His church through observing his grandfather, who planted several churches in Korea in the early 20th Century, and his

father, who planted a church in Seoul after the Korean War. He adopted his family's multigenerational calling to extend God's Kingdom and take care of His people.



Sang Hak earned his Bachelor's in Theology at HyupSung University. He has a Master of Theology degree from the Korean Methodist Theological Seminary and a Master of Divinity degree from KangNam University in Korea. He has studied at the Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky for his doctorate. Sang Hak Lee was originally ordained in Korea and has since served in churches around Korea and the United States as a minister and pastor. He has served in Korea in Seoul (a Megacity), Suji (a suburban area), Uljin (a Fishing Village), and Moongyeong (a Mountain village). In the U.S. he has served in various towns in Kansas. He has planted two churches in Uljin and Moongyeong, among other places in Korea.

Sang Hak served as the president of Cozy Mind, an organization that supports children and senior citizens who live alone in Korea. He was the pastor of the Christian High Schools' Union, the representative of a Counseling Clinic, and a Camp Director for a college students' summer retreat camp of the Korean Methodist Church.

Sang Hak Lee is a licensed Sexual Violence Counselor and Domestic Violence Counselor by the Ministry of Gender Equality & Family Republic of Korea. He was fully trained for the overseas mission hosted by the Korean Methodist Church in Seoul, Korea.

At the Great Plains Conference in Kansas and Nebraska, Sang Hak was a member of the Connecting Council and the Convener of the Mission Alignment Team. He also acted as a member of DCOM and was a Network leader in the Salina District.

Sang Hak's passion is for ministry and aspires to extend God's Kingdom on Earth and to make and support disciples of Jesus Christ. His spiritual gifts for ministry are preaching, pastoral care, and building up discipleship programs.

He is married to Jong Youn Lee and they have two daughters: Ye Joo and Ye Gang Lee. Ye Joo is a law student at Columbia Law School in New York City, and Ye Gang is a freshman at the University of Kansas in Lawrence, KS.





What is Memorial Day

Memorial Day (originally known as **Decoration Day**^[1]) is a <u>federal holiday in the United States</u> for mourning the U.S. military personnel who have died while serving in the <u>United States armed forces</u>.^[2] It is observed on <u>the last Monday</u> of May. It was formerly observed on May 30 from 1868 to 1970.^[3]

Many people visit cemeteries and memorials on Memorial Day to honor and mourn those who died while serving in the U.S. military. Many volunteers place an American flag on graves of military personnel in <u>national cemeteries</u>. Memorial Day is also considered the unofficial beginning of <u>summer</u> in the United States.^[4]

Many cities and people have claimed to have first celebrated the event. In 1868, General John A. Logan of the <u>Grand Army of the Republic</u> called for a "Decoration Day", which was widely celebrated. By 1890, every Northern state had adopted it as a holiday. The World Wars turned it into a generalized day of remembrance, instead of just for the Civil War. In 1971, Congress standardized the holiday as "Memorial Day" and changed its observance to the last Monday in May.

Two other days celebrate those who have served or are serving in the U.S. military: <u>Armed Forces</u> <u>Day</u> (which is earlier in May), an unofficial U.S. holiday for honoring those currently serving in the armed forces, and <u>Veterans Day</u> (on November 11), which honors those who have served in the <u>United States</u> <u>Armed Forces</u>.^[5]
