August Message From Pastor Lee

New Beginning

A few days ago, I found on my computer a note I had jotted down about how to adapt to a new circumstance. Probably, I read it in an article a few years ago and made a note, because I thought it might be useful at some point.

The article said that to adapt well to a new circumstance, there are six instructions. First, don't wish to be known by others. Just work hard to learn the new circumstance. Second, do whatever you learn from the new place. Third, be patient. Everybody needs time to adjust to a new circumstance. Fourth, do not ignore trivialities in a new place. When people do well for trivial things at the beginning, they can do bigger things well later. Fifth, do not worry about the future or something not happening yet. Sixth, do not worry about any failure. We are not perfect, and everybody can make mistakes at any time. If we worry about our future and failures too much, we will stay on one point and will not move forward.

I recently got here, Saint Marys. Everything is new to me and my family. My family needs time to adapt to these new circumstances. Also, you all need time to adapt to the new circumstance of me as your new pastor. So, let us remember these six instructions to adapt to this new circumstance as we move forward together.

New circumstances can come to us at any time and at any age. One day, I led services at nursing homes, and I shared with the residents about Caleb. In Joshua 14, when Caleb was 85 years old, he challenged Joshua to attack the Promised Land because God promised that land to them long ago. Caleb was willing to begin a new life because of God's promise.

Also, when we read Deuteronomy 34, we learn that Joshua received the command to lead the Israelites from Moses. At that time, he was around 93 years old. He led the Israelites as they entered the Promised Land.

There are common features between them. First, Joshua and Caleb were old men when they found themselves in new circumstances. However, they began anyway, because they knew if God is with them, age was not an issue for them. Second, they had great role models. Moses was a great role model for Joshua, and Joshua was a good role model for Caleb. Third, they trusted and obeyed God fully. Joshua chapter 1 says Joshua lived with and obeyed the Words of God. Also, Caleb believed God's promise fully that the people of Israel would get the Promised Land.

How about you?

Do you trust God fully? Please trust God fully. God is with us all the time in our routine days and in our new circumstances. When we are with God, we will be better even though we may be in a difficult situation.

Do you have a great model for your life? Yes, we have. It is Jesus Christ. He showed us how to serve and obey God, and to love others through His life.

Do you live with Words of God and obey? Even though we have a great thing, if we don't use it or don't know how to use it, it will be unworthy of our lives. Like this, everybody knows that God is good and His words are very valuable for our lives. However, if don't read and follow His directions in our daily lives, those words won't be helpful for our real lives.

Brothers and sisters in faith,

It is time to start again. Do not give up anything because of any condition. Do not be afraid of anything in our lives. Believe in God fully, follow the life of Jesus Christ, and obey His words. At that time, we can make something special in our lives. Remember as God promised Joshua to be with him all the time in Joshua 1: 5-9, He will be with us and help us accomplish our goals for Him and for us.

Who is Little Free Pantry for? LFP is for those who want and/or need to give. LFP is for those not easily able to meet everyday food and personal needs. LFP is for a hungry kid after school or a home cook who forgot to buy an onion. LFP is for everyone.

How does Little Free Pantry differ from other food pantries?

- The LFP is small, limiting its quantity and variety. Bricks-and-mortar food pantries are better at meeting pervasive need.
- But some fall through the cracks. The LFP is a safety net.
- For example, many bricks-and-mortar food pantries require an application. Most have hours of operation. Anyone may access the LFP at any time.
- Additionally, bricks-and-mortar food pantries are service providers, those who use them, "clients." LFP dissolves that professional boundary. Whether giving or taking, everyone approaches the LFP the same way, mediating the shame that accompanies need.
- LFP is a centrally-located reminder of our neighbors' need that creates neighborhood space for exercising compassion, trust, and mutual aid.


