September Message From Pastor Lee

Let's choose what God wants

Trust in the Lord, and do good; so you will live in the land, and enjoy security.

Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him, and he will act.

He will make your vindication shine like the light, and the justice of your cause like the noonday. (Psalm 37: 3-6)

We always have to make choices in our lives. Sometimes, those are very important matters in our lives, but sometimes they are not. Even though a choice may not be important in our lives, we worry about those decisions seriously and spend too much time on them. For instance, I have the experience that I spent time choosing food for lunch: a hamburger, any kind of Mexican food, a Chinese buffet, or Korean food. Sometimes, I spend time deciding whether to have a cheeseburger, a single burger, or a double burger.

Particularly, after summer, most people return to their routine lives. So, they probably have more time to choose something for their lives.

The American poet Robert Frost talked about this in his poem "The Road Not Taken."

This poem talks about choices in life. In this poem, the poet comes to a fork in the road in the woods. Both paths are very similar and overlaid with untrodden leaves. The poet chooses one and says that he will take the other another time. However, he already knows that it is not going to be easy to take the other one later. Then, he says at the last part of the poem: "I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood and I— I took the one less traveled by, and that has made all the difference."

When I read this poem, I focused on a part of the last stanza, "I took the one less traveled by."

In Genesis 13, there is a story about Abram and Lot. God asked Abram to leave his country for the land that God would show him in Genesis 12:1. When they get there in chapter 13, the land was not enough for both, Abram and Lot's sides. Due to this reason, there was often strife between them.

So, Abram suggested in verse 8 that there be no more strife and said in verse 9 "Separate yourself from me. If you take the left hand, then I will go to the right; or if you take the right hand, then I will go to the left."

As you know, Lot chose the better land, actually around Sodom and Gomorrah, but these areas were destroyed later. It means Lot's choice was not good for him and his family.

Jesus says in Matthew 7: 13-14; "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road is easy that leads to destruction, and there are many who take it. For the gate is narrow and the road is hard that leads to life, and there are few who find it."

We have to remember that when we meet a fork, sometimes, it is much better for us to pick the one that people use less or that narrow. Here is the reason: The choice God wants is not related to any kind of visible richness or visible relaxation. The choice is not always easy. The choice is not always obvious.

I hope we can choose the right things that God wants for us, so that we can prepare not only for our future in this world but for our eternal lives.
