November Message From Pastor Lee



Dear brothers and sisters in faith.

It is a season for thanksgiving now.

As everyone knows, Thanksgiving's background comes from the story of Pilgrims in America. When they arrived here in America, they thanked God for their first harvests, even though there were lots of risks as they settled in a new land.

Because of this story, Thanksgiving is a very meaningful holiday to all Americans, especially to every Christian.

However, I am sometimes so sorry for the current atmosphere of Thanksgiving. Why? Sometimes, I have felt that the Thanksgiving celebration has lost much of its original significance nowadays. It is just another holiday for uniting family members and spending time together in fun and fellowship.

I hope this Thanksgiving will be a great chance for everyone to thank God and recognize the blessings from God.

I think many people forget how grateful life is powerful.

There is a story that shows the power of thanks. It is about a Japanese businessman, Takeda. He was one of the great successful businessmen in Japan, being a major shareholder of more than 100 companies in Japan. However, he was actually famous for being the CEO of Tamago Boro, which is a very popular snack among kids. Known as "egg biscuits," its share of the market in Japan is around 60% of the kids' snack market.

To make the best snack for kids, he had two strategies. The first one was to use eggs of the best quality. The second one was the requirement for employees to say "thank you" to the biscuits, or cookies, when they make them. He said that the wave of positive minds influences the products and that if people can say "thank you" more than 3,000 times a day, their lives will be changed. So, when all employees made the egg biscuits while saying the words "thank you," the quality of the biscuits became the best. According to him, when people say "thank you," they mostly smile so that a positive atmosphere can be formed, making the best quality.

This teaching is not a new idea about thanks, because the Bible already emphasizes "thanksgiving" all the time:

- Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. (Psalms 100: 4)
- Always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. (Ephesians 5: 20-21)
- We ought always to thank God for you, brothers, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love every one of you has for each other is increasing. (2 Thessalonians 1:3)
- Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18)

There are so many reasons for us to thank God all the time. The best reason is that He saved us from sin and gave us the great hope of Heaven. Therefore, let's start to thank God in our daily lives. Let's try to make a list of things for which to thank God each day. You will find so many reasons to thank God. How about we think to start with thanks for giving us our lives?
