December Message From Pastor Lee

Dear brothers and sisters in faith,

Last Sunday was the first Sunday of Advent.

Our church calendar is divided into four main seasons: Advent, Epiphany, Lent, and Pentecost. The most important season among them in Christianity is Advent. According to The United Methodist Church Book of Worship (238), "Advent is a season of four weeks including four Sundays. Advent derives from the Latin *adventus*, which means 'coming.' The season proclaims the comings of the Christ – whose birth we prepare to celebrate once again, who comes continually in Word and Spirit, and whose return in final victory we anticipate. Each year Advent calls the community of faith to prepare for these comings; historically, the season was marked by fasts for preparation."

Over the years, the meaning of Advent has been changed to generally mean the coming of Christ: It could be the season to celebrate the first coming or the season to prepare for His second coming. In other words, this season is for celebrating the beginning of God's salvation with the birth of Jesus Christ and for preparing for His second coming as the judge at the end of the world.

In addition, there is one more meaning -- God continually comes in words and Spirit. It means the presence of the Holy Spirit as the Counselor, whom Jesus Christ promised to his disciples at the end of his works on Earth (John 15: 26).

Therefore, Advent includes the coming of Jesus Christ in the past, the second coming of Jesus Christ in the future, and the presence of the Holy Spirit, who continually stays and takes care of us in the present.

In conclusion, these three viewpoints are very important and meaningful to us. However, we need to focus on the second coming of Jesus Christ now because we need to prepare for the future when Jesus Christ comes again rather than only celebrate His birth.

We need to spend this season with a holy heart for being ready to stand fairly in front of God when we meet Him. Also, we need to spend this season with the new hope, and the promise of Jesus Christ that he will come again. If we spend this season with these attitudes, we can celebrate a true Christmas this year.





The Journey



Irresistible, Reclaiming the New that Jesus Unleashed For the World

Once upon a time there was a version of our faith that was practically . . . irresistible. What did first-century Christians know that we don't? In this six-session study, Andy Stanley will invite you to embrace the version of faith that, against all odds, initiated a chain of events resulting in the most significant and extensive cultural transformation the world has ever seen. A version we must embrace if we are to be salt and light in an increasingly savorless and dark world. Two thousand years ago, Christians risked persecution and death for the sake of their faith. What would happen if 21st-century believers followed their lead? Taking you back to a time when Christianity couldn't be ignored, marginalized, or eradicated, Stanley shows how the early church turned the world upside down---and how we can recover that same faith.

Andy helps us consider the faith modeled by our first-century brothers and sisters who had no official Bible, and little chance of survival. What made their faith so irresistible? Andy will invite you to embrace the faith that caused the most significant cultural transformation the world has ever seen and how Jesus's arrival signaled that the Old Testament was fulfilled and its laws reduced to a single verb - love - to be applied to God, neighbor, and enemy.
