February Message From Pastor Lee

Dear brothers and sisters in faith,

I hope you are doing well.

It seems we are still in difficult situations because of the coronavirus, flu, and cold. However, I am thankful God has guided us safely. So, we could start this new year with new hope for our future.

This month, Ash Wednesday is on the 22nd. Then, Easter Sunday is April 9. Every year, Easter Sunday is on a different date because the date for Easter is determined by an ancient luni-solar calendar instead of by the Gregorian Calendar that people use today. Easter always occurs on the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, which is the first full moon that occurs after the vernal equinox, which signifies spring in the northern hemisphere.

This year, the vernal equinox is on March 20, making the first full moon after that date April 6 and the following Sunday—April 9—Easter. In church history, the earliest Easter fell on March 22 in 1818.

Then, Lent is determined by counting 40 days before Easter, except Sundays. So, when we count like this, the first day of Lent is always Wednesday, called Ash Wednesday.

Ashes were an ancient symbol of our humanity. In Genesis, we read that God formed human beings out of the dust of the earth (Genesis 2:7). The Hebrew word for "dust" is occasionally translated "ashes" elsewhere. Throughout scripture, ashes are part of rituals when people seek forgiveness and mourn their sins (see Numbers 19:9, 17; Hebrews 9:13; Jonah 3:6; Matthew 11:21, and Luke 10:13, among others).

According to the United Methodist Church, Lent is a time of repentance, fasting, and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians.

Today, Christians focus on our relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

However, people sometimes used this season of Lent for their pleasure. A long time ago, some people didn't eat any meat or ate only two meals a day in the season of Lent. Due to these reasons, some people thought they needed to eat a lot before Ash Wednesday. So, the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday became known as "Fat Tuesday," or "Mardi Gras." Polish people eat paczki on Fat Tuesday. Paczki is a deepfried dough shaped into spheres and filled with sweet fillings. In France, a carnival called Mardi Gras was started to prepare for Easter, but it changed for the worse later. People started to drink and to go on the rampage at that time. It was changed for people's pleasure.

Any ritual without true meaning is always meaningless. Because of this reason, Jesus didn't like Pharisees and their hypocrisy.

Remember that it is important to have a good-looking Ash Wednesday service, Palm Sunday Service, and Easter Sunday Service. However, if people don't put real meanings on each Sunday, and if people don't examine themselves and don't repent, it will mean nothing to God and us.

I hope we all can have time for our spiritual growth in faith through our repentance and self-examination in this season of Lent. I hope we all can change our lives to grow in faith this season. I hope we all have more time to meet Jesus through prayer and the Word of God in this season of Lent. I hope we all can remember Jesus' sacrifice and love for us in this season. Then, I hope we all can experience real peace and comfort.




Irresistible, Reclaiming the New that Jesus Unleashed For the World

Once upon a time there was a version of our faith that was practically . . . irresistible. What did first-century Christians know that we don't? In this six-session study, Andy Stanley will invite you to embrace the version of faith that, against all odds, initiated a chain of events resulting in the most significant and extensive cultural transformation the world has ever seen. A version we must embrace if we are to be salt and light in an increasingly savorless and dark world. Two thousand years ago, Christians risked persecution and death for the sake of their faith. Wurmbrand: Tortured For Christ

On February 29, 1948, Richard Wurmbrand was arrested by the secret police. His crime? Leading Christian worship and witnessing - both of which were illegal under Romania's atheistic Communist regime. Because of Richard's faithfulness to Christ, he endured 14 years of prison and torture, while his wife, Sabina, suffered three years in a labor camp.

In spite of these hardships, Richard and Sabina had an unshakeable faith in Christ. *Wurmbrand* explores the inspiring lives of Richard and Sabina Wurmbrand. Your faith will be inspired as you go deep inside the darkest prison cells to see how the light of Christ continues to shine from the hearts of those totally committed to Him.

Before communism fell in Eastern Europe, Christians were often arrested and kept in prisons or labor camps where the communists went to great lengths to break their faith. We will explore real life story of a family whose faith endured. After living multiple imprisonments, the Wurmbrands began a ministry now known as "The Voice of the Martyrs" to bring awareness to the persecution of Christians. Hear their incredible story through Richard's and Sabrina's own voices and interviews with their son Mihai.

THE **VOICE OF THE MARTYRS** is a non-profit interdenominational organization dedicated to assisting the persecuted church worldwide. VOM was founded in 1967 by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who was imprisoned by Communist Romania for fourteen years for his faith in Jesus Christ. Today VOM spreads the message of the persecuted church and sends help through a network of international offices. VOM is located in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, and can be found at www.persecuted.com.


