March Message From Pastor Lee

Christ's Letter

When I was a child, I was told sheep had bad eyesight and could not see very far. Due to this reason, they always would follow other sheep in front of them. But this information was wrong.

According to a resource, sheep depend heavily on their vision. They have excellent peripheral vision and can see behind themselves without turning their heads.

However, the resource said there is a reason they follow one another all the time. Sheep have a strong social instinct to follow the sheep in front of them. When one sheep decides to go somewhere, the rest of the flock usually follows, even if it is not a good decision. Then, the resource says, for example, that sheep will follow each other to slaughter. Or, the others are likely to follow if one sheep jumps over a cliff.

Because they follow others without reason, they don't expect what is waiting in front of them. I think we are the same as sheep. We don't know our future. Even though science is quite developed, there are still many things people cannot predict.

However, all Christians always look up to our God, our helper, guide, and Lord, and can find their directions from God. That is faith which is our benefit and power.

Of course, many people still deny or misunderstand our God. Sometimes, they partly believe in God in their own ways because they don't feel who God exactly is and what God's grace and love are in their lives.

1 John 4: 12 says, "No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us." And Matthew 5: 16 also says, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

Disaffiliation Update

On February 12, a Church Conference was held to vote on disaffiliation. 96 members of our congregation attended.

The YES vote carried to disaffiliate with 84 YES votes, 12 NO votes and 0 ABSTAIN votes.

The Disaffiliation Committee is continuing it's work and has scheduled our meeting with the conference board of trustees, which will be Tuesday, March 14, 2023. Members of our committee are hard at work gathering all the documents needed for the trustee meeting. At that meeting the conference trustees will give us the final disaffiliation amount. Afterwards, our church will need to hold a church conference to affirm/accept the final disaffiliation amount. If affirmed, and the annual conference votes to accept our disaffiliation amount, all final paperwork, documents, and payments will have to be submitted to conference by August 16, 2023.





Wurmbrand: Tortured For Christ

On February 29, 1948, Richard Wurmbrand was arrested by the secret police. His crime? Leading Christian worship and witnessing - both of which were illegal under Romania's atheistic Communist regime. Because of Richard's faithfulness to Christ, he endured 14 years of prison and torture, while his wife, Sabina, suffered three years in a labor camp.

In spite of these hardships, Richard and Sabina had an unshakeable faith in Christ. *Wurmbrand* explores the inspiring lives of Richard and Sabina Wurmbrand. Your faith will be inspired as you go deep inside the darkest prison cells to see how the light of Christ continues to shine from the hearts of those totally committed to Him.

Before communism fell in Eastern Europe, Christians were often arrested and kept in prisons or labor camps where the communists went to great lengths to break their faith. We will explore real life story of a family whose faith endured. After living multiple imprisonments, the Wurmbrands began a ministry now known as "The Voice of the Martyrs" to bring awareness to the persecution of Christians. Hear their incredible story through Richard's and Sabrina's own voices and interviews with their son Mihai.

THE **VOICE OF THE MARTYRS** is a non-profit interdenominational organization dedicated to assisting the persecuted church worldwide. VOM was founded in 1967 by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who was imprisoned by Communist Romania for fourteen years for his faith in Jesus Christ. Today VOM spreads the message of the persecuted church and sends help through a network of international offices. VOM is located in Bartlesville, Oklahoma, and can be found at www.persecuted.com.
